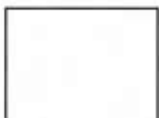

Three keynote lectures as well as a great number of research papers, lecture demonstrations, roundtable discussions and movement workshops will give the participants an outstanding opportunity to gain new knowledge on dance. It is our experience that by providing different modes of exchanging dance knowledge we are able to create a very fruitful conference environment for the participants.

The conference opens on Thursday with a dance performance by the Icelandic Dance Company, directed by Katrin Hall. The conference is closed on Sunday with a special showing and discussion of "MOVING NORTH - 10 Short Dance Films" which is the result of a Nordic Dance for Camera project that had its world premiere in 2003.
