GEORGIANA WIERRE-GORE

Georgiana Gore is Professor of Anthropology at Blaise Pascal University, Clermont-Ferrand, France. She heads the LAPRACOR, a research centre on the Anthropology of Corporeal Practices, and the Masters programme in Dance Anthropology. Professor of Humanities and Performing Arts at Bard College, Annandale-on-Hudson, NY.
