

## Cognitive Aspects of Dance

The NOFOD Board invites research papers related to «dance knowledge». We would like to encourage a wide understanding of dance knowledge. Dance knowledge can include the sharpened and advanced discussion on cognitive aspects on a high theoretical or a practical level.

Researchers may discuss historical, cultural or political aspects of knowledge or introduce new or old theories and methods for producing dance knowledge. They can reflect on various modes of knowing in dance and dilemmas of communicating dance knowledge.

The theme can also be related to artistic research and continuing education of dancers. We encourage researchers in various dance and movement disciplines to consider from their own perspective what is the most important or interesting aspects of the theme, including critical comments on knowledge and cognition.

The framework for the Trondheim conference will also offer NOFOD members and non-members opportunities to propose lecture-demonstrations, round table discussion, study groups and posters. The NOFOD Board will aim to structure sessions in a way that allows time for discussion and the exchange of ideas.

## NOFOD

## Keynote Speakers

The NOFOD board has invited three outstanding keynote lecturers

**Dr Maxine Sheets-Johnstone (US)** is an independent scholar who most recently was Visiting Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Oregon. She is the author of several books including *The Phenomenology of Dance* (1986) and *The Primacy of Movement* (1999). Her research interests include natural history, phenomenology, philosophical anthropology, cognitive sciences and zoology.

**Dr. Stephanie Jordan (UK)** is Research Professor in Dance at University of Surrey, Roehampton. She has authored two books: *Striding Out: Aspects of Contemporary and New Dance in Britain* (1992) and *Moving Music: Dialogues with Music in Twentieth Century Ballet* (2000). Research interests: current historical and analytical theories and methodologies, music and dance, 20th century dance.

**Dr. László Felföldi (HUN)** is the Head of the Folk Dance Department, Institute for Musicology, Academy of Sciences, Budapest. His numerous publications mostly arise from over 20 years of extensive fieldwork in the Carpathian Basin with additional research in Bulgaria, Turkey and Moldavia.

**Suraya Hilal (UK)** is a dance artist, choreographer and teacher with a deep knowledge and engagement in Egyptian dance heritage. As result of research and innovative work she has presented this heritage as contemporary art form now called *Hilal Dance* all over Europe on stage and in teaching.

The official languages are Scandinavian and English. The plenary sessions will be in English, and parallel sessions will be organized so that one of the sessions will be in English. People who do not understand Scandinavian language will always find an English option.
